OCTOBER 2 – PROTECTING YOUR HOUSE FROM TERMITES

Do you have conditions in your building that may attract termites? Stacey Cole will share his years of experience in the exterminator business with the class on how to protect your building from becoming the next victim of termite damage. He will discuss simple measures one can take to protect their building from Dry Rot, Subterranean, and the newest scourge to arrive on the Island, Formosan termites.

OCTOBER 16 – EXPLORING HISTORIC WALL COVERINGS

Like most things, styles of wall decoration fall in and out of fashion. Ethan Bradshaw of WallEx in Houston will discuss the variety of historic wall coverings over the years and how these were applied. Whether restoring your historic house or installing an accent, Ethan will show you how to make a lasting impression.

OCTOBER 23 – RESTORING AND REPAIRING STAINED GLASS

From churches to residences, stained glass has been used to decorate many historic buildings. Constant exposure to the elements, harsh Texas sunlight, and unforeseen accidents can damage these works of art. During this session skilled artisan Karen Farrell will show the class various ways to maintain and repair decorative stained glass.

NOVEMBER 13 – RESEARCHING YOUR HISTORIC PROPERTY

Ever wanted to solve a mystery about your historic house? Learn how to research the story of your historic property with the help of GHF's Matt Farragher at GHF's Preservation Resource Center.

Note: This class will take place at the 1861 U.S. Custom House at 502 20th Street and will show where to search for historic images, maps, photographs and even learn who lived there in the past.

NOVEMBER 20 – REPAIRING AND RESTORING YOUR HISTORIC DOORS

Don't replace that historic wood door, restore it! Many Galveston buildings have great historic doors that give these properties character and are made from strong materials that are almost impossible to replace. Some elbow grease, the right tools, and a bit of historic know-how can bring these beauties back from the brink of being lost. Restoration craftsman Michael Morris will share his years of experience on returning historic doors to their former luster.
