1900 Storm Building Survivor Program



As a way to commemorate the centennial of the 1900 Storm, the 1900 Storm Committee in conjunction with Galveston Historical Foundation, developed the 1900 Storm Building Survivor Program. The program encourages people who own structures that survived the Storm to apply for the 1900 Storm Survivor Plaque. The 1900 Storm Survivor Plaques are an important way for the community to recognize Galveston's history and significant, early historic buildings.

Buildings in Galveston, such as houses, churches, commercial buildings, and others, are eligible if they were built before the 1900 Storm and survive. **To obtain a 1900 Storm Survivor Plaque, please complete the form on the reverse side of this page.**

If you are unsure about the date of construction for your building, you can use the following sources to research the date your building was constructed:

Approval of your building as a 1900 Storm Survivor entitles you to display the specially designed 1900 Storm Survivor Plaque. If your building had resin 1900 Storm Survivor Plaque and you would like to upgrade to a bronze marker, the cost will be \$100 (including tax). The plaque is approximately 8 inches high and is made of bronze. Its distinctive shape is modeled after the official 1900 Storm Commemoration logo. These plaques may only be obtained through the Preservation Resource Center, Galveston Historical Foundation, and are to be used exclusively to mark buildings which survived the 1900 Storm.

If you have documentation that would help establish the date of your building's construction, please include a copy of it with your application.
